Banjika: Case Study in School Transformation

Lydia, an educator for over 17 years, is the Principal at Banjika Secondary School in Tanzania. TeachUNITED began working with Banjika in 2015. Lydia's decisive leadership and determination, coupled with TeachUNITED's coaching and support, have contributed to dramatic shifts at her school.

Lydia, like many rural school principals, has faced many challenges over the years, yet she faces each one with determination and resilience. "There are many obstacles an educator has to overcome in Tanzania, and as a leader I have faced my own share of challenges - particularly unmotivated teachers and poor infrastructure that slows us down considerably."

Lydia has endeavored to fill these gaps by working side-by-side with her students and teachers, communicating closely with education officials, and collaborating closely with TeachUNITED. TeachUNITED works with Lydia to ensure Banjika has access to world-class teacher training programs and educational materials and technology for students.

"After working with TeachUNITED, teachers talk less. They are free from chalk dust. Students are active and independent and look for more details on the materials they are taught, rather than waiting for a teacher's answer. The lesson is more interesting and engaging for both teachers and students. In fact, we have seen academic improvement in the subjects taught using the tablets."



In Tanzania partner schools, more young people are staying in school longer and growing academically.


This transformation is happening across very different schools – a government school with some of the lowest pass rates in Tanzania and a private school with some of the highest pass rates in the region. **The biggest growth is happening with girls,** who are starting behind the boys and catching up quickly.

Form IV National Exam "Pass with Promotion" Rates




More about the Form IV Exam

Students take the Form IV at the end of their second year of high school. Students who "pass with promotion" can continue in school and possibly pursue higher education and better paying careers. Students who do not pass are forced to leave school.



We are thrilled to see **15% more students** at our first primary school partner passing primary school this year!

Teachers have been very positive about the TeachUNITED training program, and we have seen real changes in the classroom: co-teaching, differentiated learning, and increased use of technology leading to higher student motivation.

Costa Rica:

Steady Gains in Math Learning


At Bajo de Chilamate school, teachers use the TeachUNITED tablets to help students learn, and become more excited about, math. Jose Ignacio Arce Rodríguez is a star math student. He recently won the Mathematical Circuit Olympiad, a local math competition.

According to José Ignacio; "I studied a lot of math with the help of my teacher and my dad who is a farmer and my main motivator. I take the [TeachUNITED] tablet to my house and review math with the help of the materials that my teacher gives me. When I won the first place in the Olympics, my dad was very happy and proud."

José Ignacio continues studying with the help of his teacher, father, and TeachUNITED resources.






"I enjoy facilitating and gently challenging students and teachers to think deeply about their learning and teaching experiences.


The best teachers are always learning

TeachUNITED focuses energy and resources on the courageous teachers in the education system who are willing to step up and become change agents in their school communities.



Many factors shape a child's success, but in school nothing matters as much as the quality of teaching. In fact, it has been found that having a high-quality teacher in primary school can substantially offset the influence of poverty on school test scores. 2

And ways of teaching better can be learned. When teachers receive precise instruction together with specific, regular feedback under the mentorship of an instructional coach - preferably a long-term coach, teachers can see large positive effects in the classroom.⁴



We leverage our teacher's ideas, and educational best practices, to improve our model and make progress towards our goal: improve educational outcomes for underserved youth.

1 DEFINE

What are the individual needs of the participants? What are the desired outcomes? What metrics can be measured to track success? What program options are available or do new prototypes need to be created?

Define - Ideate - Prototype

2MEASURE

Measure teacher and student outcomes including benchmark, interim, and summative cycles.

ANALYZE

Review actual outcome data compared to program goals.

4 IMPROVE

Make corrections and adjustments as needed to meet desired outcomes.

5 CONTROL

Maintain program operations to ensure continued success.




