EMPOWERING STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS ALIKE TO REALIZE THEIR FULLEST POTENTIAL

Transformative Best Practices: The core finding of our impact study reveals that the TeachUNITED program is positively advancing the dissemination and coaching of transformative best practices in teaching and learning. Evidence-based strategies, such as purpose and mindset, student engagement, personalization, and data-driven instruction, are driving improvements in various aspects.

Exceptional Student Outcomes: TeachUNITED schools witnessed nearly 10% more primary students accessing secondary education and a 94% increase in secondary students pass with promotion rates (i.e. readiness for post-secondary), both one year after program completion.

Increased Teacher Effectiveness: Over 90% of participating teachers reported improved teaching practices, increased motivation, and a stronger sense of positive impact on their students' lives.



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Empowering Local Educators: Instructional Coaching for Sustained School Improvements in Rural Tanzania
Key Findings | Monduli District, Arusha Region, Tanzania | 2021 - 2022

- Nearly 10% more students were able to access secondary education.
- Secondary schools increased in regional ranking from 56th percentile to 94th percentile.
- Students saw +18 percentage points growth in reading, and +16 percentage points growth in math.
- More than 90% of educators reported improved instructional strategies and increases in self-efficacy and motivation.
- Teachers' intention to continue in the education profession increased by 13 percent over the course of the program.

When comparing TeachUNITED schools pre- and post-intervention to control schools.

TeachUNITED contributed the Education Impact Study to gain a systems view of the impact this work has had in the Monduli District of Arusha Region, Tanzania. In the 6 years since TeachUNITED started working in Monduli District, we have reached 2,156 educators in 75 schools, who in turn have served 89,925 students.

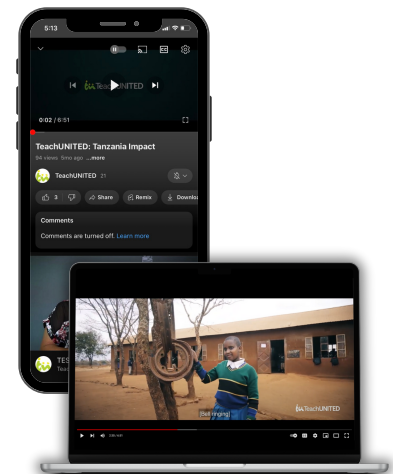
Ensuring children receive an equitable, quality education starts with having great teachers. Teacher quality is the single biggest school-related factor in student success (Doppen, 2016). However, in underserved and rural communities, due to limiting factors like isolation and constrained budgets, schools lack access to the one tool that reliably impacts student achievement: high-quality teacher training.

TeachUNITED bridges those gaps by combining community-based teacher coaching with evidence-based pedagogical training in a scalable package that allows local education leaders to own, co-design, and adapt content-specific strategies to increase academic achievement.

In the 6 years since TeachUNITED started working in Monduli District, they have reached 2,156 educators in 75 schools, who in turn have served 89,925 students.

Of seven districts in Tanzania's Arusha Region, Monduli District is one of the most rural. Teachers and schools in the district face daunting challenges in ensuring students have access to quality education, as many children must labor in fields, and teachers are working with few resources and very large class sizes. We highlight two special schools from the Monduli District making great strides to improve teaching practices and student outcomes.

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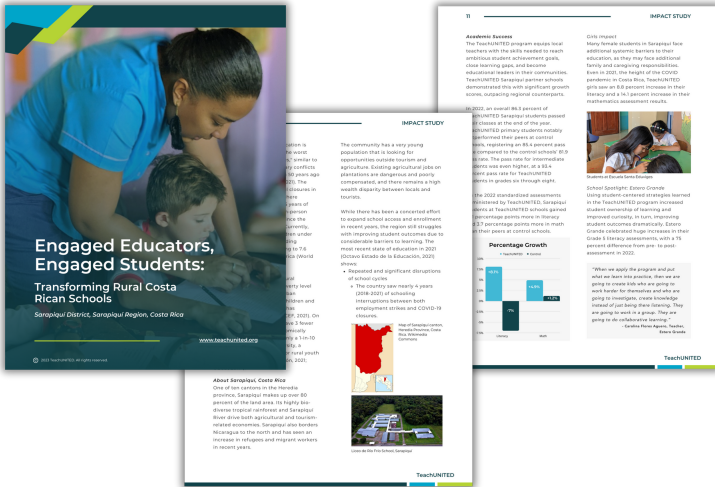

TRANSFORMING RURAL COSTA RICAN SCHOOLS, ONE CLASSROOM AT A TIME

- Enhanced Teaching Practices:** Over 90% of participating teachers reported improved teaching practices and the ability to engage previously unmotivated students. They now share a collective belief in their profound impact on students' lives.
- Remarkable Student Outcomes:** TeachUNITED has led to significant gains in specific content areas, with students showing 15.1 percentage points higher growth in literacy and 3.7 percentage points higher growth in mathematics compared to control schools.
- Empowering Teachers:** Our program has rekindled teacher engagement and motivation, with a resounding 99% of Sarapiquí educators feeling motivated to teach. Furthermore, participants' intentions to continue working as educators increased by 6.2% from pre-to-post survey.



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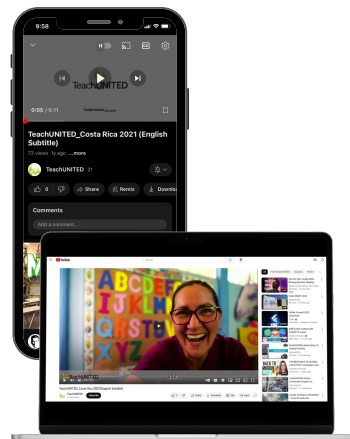
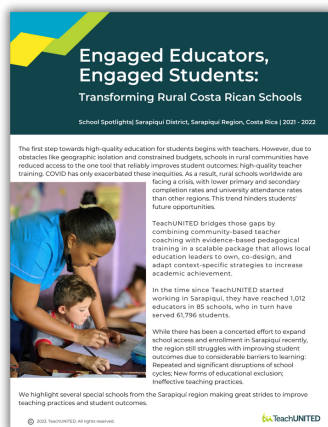
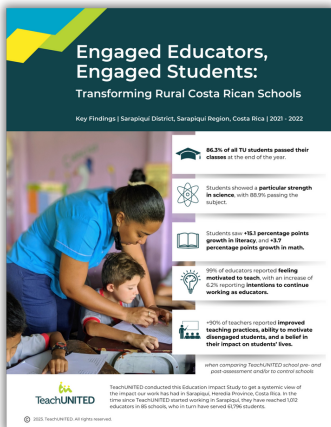
