TeachUNITED's Monitoring & Evaluation Team recently analyzed data from 2023 participants. We're excited to release those results with the upcoming Q2 report, but here's a taste of the transformative impact TU coaches, teachers, and students are making!

EAST AFRICA: INCREASED GRADUATION RATES BY 10%



TU helps more kids graduate. TU primary schools in East Africa improved graduation rates by 10.4% in 2023, while control schools actually dropped 10% — meaning **TU schools outperformed controls by 20 percentage points.**



LATIN AMERICA: IMPROVEMENT IN READING SKILLS TU improves foundational skills. In Latin America, young learners continue to build strong foundations, as TeachUNITED early primary students grew 57% more in reading fluency than their peers at comparison schools.



UNITED STATES: GROWTH FOR LOW-INCOME STUDENTS

TU works to close student achievement gaps. Low-income students in the U.S. were particularly well-served by the TU Program. Proficiency rates for both literacy (55% vs. 2%) and math (10% vs. 6%) increased greatly compared to peers.




LAUNCHING A GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIP IN ZANZIBAR

TeachUNITED was thrilled to be the chosen 'Innovator' for the Elimu-Soko program's expansion into Zanzibar, Tanzania.

This project, supported by Hempel Foundation, Axum, and the Zanzibar Ministry of Education, launched on February 5th and will improve education quality for 20,000 primary students this year. TU will train 250 educators and government officials in Zanzibar on contextually relevant solutions to the challenges they face to sustainably boost outcomes for each child within the school system for years to come

PROGRAM LAUNCH TO SUPPORT NEW TEACHERS

Did you know that 30% of new teachers in the U.S. left their schools after the 2022-23 school year?

TeachUNITED is working hard to decrease teacher turnover, and it's working! **100% of participating schools improved teacher retention**.

In Q1, the U.S. team launched a specialized coaching program for early career teachers in New Hampshire. The first few years for a new teacher can be some of the most difficult. This program aims to support their specific needs, giving them practical advice and strategies as they begin their teaching careers. A new teacher program participant shared:

"I like that the TU coach prompted us to think about what strategies we already have in place, those that we're interested in implementing, and those that we'd like more assistance with. She offered many opportunities to voice our opinions and thoughts and discuss what works or doesn't work in our classrooms."
